

## PSYCHOLOGY INTERNSHIP SITES

See the list of sites below, which are categorized into five categories: *I. Adult Mental Health, II. Child Mental Health/Social Services and Education, III. Forensic / Legal Services (Child and Adult), IV. Industrial-Organizational/ Human Resources, V. Parent and Family Intervention Services, and VI. PSY Internships in Ministry Settings.* These sites have supervised PSY students in the past. In addition to this list of sites for previous interns, SPU also uses the Handshake program which allows students to find internships through employees advertising there.
